## Bookmobile: On the Road Again, Soon!



KCPL's new Bookmobile service will return just in time for the start of school. Farber Specialty Vehicles of Columbus, OH spent much of early 2023 building the new vehicle while Applied Graphics Ltd. provided its new creative look.

Bookmobile service was first introduced by KCPL in 1934, and since then has provided quality mobile library service to underserved areas of Kanawha County.

## Get to know us!

What is your role at KCPL? My title is Facilities Associate. Primarily, I help handle orders and requisitions. Mostly, these are for Facilities or Administrative supplies, so essentially things like janitorial items and office supplies. Part of my job is also inventory and ensuring we keep a ready supply on hand for day-to-day usage and place orders for any needed items. We also distribute supplies to all the branch



offices from our stores, handle any incoming shipment by logging them, checking the inventory, and ensuring they go to the correct branch or department. I've found a supportive work environment here with coworkers eager to assist and instruct.

So I hear you're into D&D... What's up with that? It started, as so many stories do, while I was attending college. During my time there I was first introduced to Tabletop Roleplaying Games (TTRPG) via White Wolf's *World of Darkness* series, in particular *Changeling: the Dreaming*, which was my favorite game line. I quickly came to adore the setting and found it was a way to be creative, entertain, and engage in a social event without all the usual pressures. After graduating from Marshall I set the hobby aside for more than a decade until a friend of mine mentioned he was putting together a *Dungeons & Dragons* group that consisted of KCPL employees. Even with all the dizzying advancements of technology – machine learning, photorealistic graphics, instantaneous networking, etc., the most potent creative engine in the world is still the human mind.

You are coordinating volunteers for this year's WV Book Festival Used Book Sale. Are you excited? Scared? A bit of both! I would say it is easily the single largest project of my docket at the moment. It's an amazing space to work in, and the sheer volume alters the necessary approach, but it's also an awesome opportunity to not only assist the Book Festival, but give back to the community as well. I'm sure there will be challenges and unforeseen obstacles, but I am confident with a bit of tenacity, hard work, and a team effort we can have another successful year.
